

REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS

Greensville County is currently soliciting proposals from qualified engineering firms for design, and bidding services for the Otterdam Road, Phase II Project. The project is being constructed in order to improve the roadway infrastructure on SR 614 – Otterdam Road.

The proposed improvements consist of upgrading approximately 3200 lf of existing VDOT roadway and the replacement of a substandard bridge. The consulting engineer will: provide all of the plans/specifications for the project, be responsible for identifying and assisting with all environmental requirements/associated permits, insure that all VDOT requirements are met, identify property (such as easements and/or right-of-way) that must be acquired, prepare the advertisement for construction bids, review the construction bids received, and make a formal recommendation on awarding the construction project. All work must be in conformance with all regulatory requirements and permitting agencies.

This project is being constructed with a combination of VDOT Locally Administered Project (LAP) funds, local funds, and funds from other grant and/or loan agencies. Other funds may include the Virginia Tobacco Commission, the Virginia Transportation Infrastructure Bank, and/or other sources.

Proposals must be received prior to 2:00 p.m. on April 6, 2016. Proposals received after the stated date and time will be returned unopened. Proposals must be submitted to the attention of Moses A. Clements, at the Greensville County Administration Building, 1781 Greensville County Circle, Emporia, VA 23847. Responses must be clearly marked on the exterior of the package as **“Engineering Proposal for Otterdam Road, Phase II.”** Four copies of the proposal should be provided.
