SOLID WASTE COLLECTION TRUCK DRIVER

FLSA Status: Non-Exempt

GENERAL DEFINITION AND CONDITIONS OF WORK:

Performs difficult semiskilled work in the operation of automotive and large equipment at refuse sites throughout the county; does related work as required. Work is performed under regular supervision of the Solid Waste Collection Sites Manager.

This is heavy work requiring the exertion of 50 pounds of force occasionally, up to 20 pounds of force frequently, and up to 10 pounds of force constantly to move objects; work requires stooping, kneeling, crouching, crawling, reaching, standing, walking, pushing, pulling, lifting, grasping, feeling and repetitive motions; vocal communication is required for expressing or exchanging ideas by means of the spoken word; hearing is required to perceive information at normal spoken word levels; visual acuity is required for depth perception, peripheral vision, assembly or fabrication of parts at or within arms length, operations of machines, operation of motor vehicles or equipment, determining the accuracy and thoroughness of work and observing general surrounding and activities; the worker is subject to inside and outside environmental conditions, extreme cold, extreme heat, noise, vibration, hazards, atmospheric conditions and oils.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS/TYPICAL TASKS:

Operates automotive and occasionally large equipment; makes minor repairs to equipment; clears refuse sites of trash outside of the receptacles.


Subject: Land Acquisition for Economic Dev. Purposes

SUBJECT: Greenville/Emporia DSS/New Building Project/Term Sheet

A. Goals.

1. High quality facility.
2. Eligible for cost reimbursement from the State DSS.
3. The County and the City will have equitable ownership interests in the building after it has been paid for.

B. Applicable Statute.

1. Va. Code Ann. § 63.2-401 provides for the State DSS to reimburse localities for 50% of "administrative expenditures."
 - a. We understand that the State DSS is reimbursing administrative expenditures at 85% under current practices.
2. Va. Code § 63.2-401 provides for the State DSS to reimburse local DSS for the costs of office space at the reimbursement level for administrative expenditures (50%). Section 63.2-401 provides:

The Commissioner shall also reimburse monthly, to the extent funds are available for such purposes, each county, city or district fiscal officer out of state and federal funds, to the extent provided in the preceding paragraph, for monthly rental payments for office space provided the local department in publicly owned buildings, for payments that are based on the cost of initial construction or purchase of a building or a reasonable amount for depreciation of such building, and for the cost of repairs and alterations for either a privately or publicly owned building. However, no monthly rental payment shall exceed a reasonable amount as determined by the Commissioner.

C. DSS Regulations/Policies.

1. The County will contact State DSS to confirm that the proposed project meets State reimbursement requirements.

D. Project Structure.

1. Joint Economic Development Authority. The County and the City will create a joint economic development authority pursuant to Va. Code § 15.2-4916.
 - a. The Joint EDA will have a five member Board of Directors. Three members will be appointed by the County and two members appointed by the City, consistent with the structure of the existing DSS Board.
2. Subdivision of Parcel. The County will subdivide a parcel for the new DSS building in the existing office park.
3. Conveyance of Parcel to EDA. The County will convey the parcel to the EDA.
 - a. Reversion Clause. Should the deed conveying the parcel to the EDA include a provision for the property to revert back to the County if the DSS breaches its lease obligations to the EDA?
4. Construction Financing. The EDA will arrange for construction financing with Rural Development, the Virginia Resource Authority, or another lender.
5. EDA/County Services Agreement to support construction. The EDA and the County will enter into a Services Agreement for the County to provide administrative services and support to the EDA for arranging the construction financing and managing the construction project.
 - a. Compensation to the County?
6. Deed of Trust. The County expects that the lender will require the financing be secured by a Deed of Trust on the property.
7. Revenue Support Agreement. The County expects that the lender will also require that the County and the City enter into agreements with the DSS to make payments to the DSS as needed for the DSS to make lease payments. The County expects that this agreement will include a pledge of any payments received by the County and the City through the State DSS for the reimbursement of building or lease expenses.
8. Construction Contract. The EDA will enter into architectural, engineering, and construction contracts as needed to construct the building.
 - a. The County will support the EDA in developing and administering these contracts.

9. Lease. The EDA will lease the building to the DSS. The lease payments will be structured to cover the construction and the related costs, operating expenses, and depreciation.
 - a. Services. The lease will provide for the County to provide routine interior maintenance, exterior maintenance, major building component maintenance, landscaping and lawn care, and snow removal. The County will not provide janitorial services or utilities (telephone, internet, water and sewer).
 - b. Duration. The duration of the lease shall be as needed to provide for the retirement of the construction financing and related expenses.
 - c. Default Provisions. The lease agreement will include customary default provisions.

10. Equitable Ownership Interests. The project documents will provide for the County to have a 55% equitable ownership interest in the new building and for the City to have a 45% equitable ownership interest in the new building.

Approval of Accounts Payable for January 4, 2016, in the amount of \$194,381.80

Approval of Payroll for December 31, 2015, in the amount of \$410,415.55

In Re: Public Hearing

Mr. Whittington stated that Staff recommended the Board of Supervisors go into Public Hearing to solicit public comments regarding the Thomas O'Neal Palmer & David Palmer Condemnation – Route 58 Water and Sewer Extension Project

Supervisor Ferguson moved, seconded by Supervisor Lee, to go into Public Hearing. Voting aye: Supervisors Bryant, Ferguson, Lee and Chairman Wiley.

In Re: Thomas O'Neal Palmer & David Palmer Condemnation – Route 58 Water and Sewer Extension Project

Mr. Lin Pope, Director of Planning, addressed the Board of Supervisors stating that Staff had been trying to get a temporary easement from the Palmer family who owned a small piece of property at the intersection of Highway 58 and Carter Road. He stated that numerous letters had been sent, Staff had been on social media and finally retrieved a phone number off the internet. He also stated that Staff had been calling and left messages without any response. He further stated that it was getting late in the process to finish the easements for the water and sewer line construction, so Staff would be moving forward on obtaining the temporary easement by condemnation.

Mr. Whittington asked if there were anyone present to speak regarding the proposed condemnation. There was no one.

In Re: Return to Regular Session

Mr. Whittington stated that Staff recommended the Board of Supervisors return to Regular Session.

Supervisor Ferguson moved, seconded by Supervisor Lee, to return to Regular Session. Voting aye: Supervisors Bryant, Ferguson, Lee and Chairman Wiley.

In Re: Approval of Resolution #16-90 – Condemnation for Public Use and to Enter and Take Temporary Construction Easement in Real Property Identified on Tax Map #20-38

Mr. Whittington stated that Staff requested approval of the following Resolution #16-90.

RESOLUTION# 16-90 OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF GREENSVILLE COUNTY, VIRGINIA, ON BEHALF OF GREENSVILLE COUNTY, VIRGINIA, TO AUTHORIZE CONDEMNATION FOR PUBLIC USE AND TO ENTER AND TAKE TEMPORARY CONSTRUCTION EASEMENT IN REAL PROPERTY IDENTIFIED AS TAX MAP NO. 20-38

RECITALS:

WHEREAS, utility improvements are being installed along U. S. Highway 58 to serve public purposes (the “Project”); and

WHEREAS, as a part of the Project Greenville County, Virginia (“County”) needs to acquire a temporary construction easement traversing a 0.048± (±2,080 square feet) portion of real property identified as Tax Map Parcel No. 20-38, situate in Belfield Magisterial District, and titled in the names of Thomas O’Neal Palmer and David Palmer; and

WHEREAS, Tax Map Parcel No. 20-38 is owned by Thomas O’Neal Palmer and David Palmer; and

WHEREAS, the County has been unable to locate Thomas O’Neal Palmer, and has therefore been unable to negotiate for purchase of his one-half (1/2) undivided interest in the temporary construction easement; and

WHEREAS, although the County has contact information for David Palmer, he has not responded to correspondence or telephone calls, and as a result, the County has not been

successful in acquiring David Palmer's one-half (1/2) undivided interest in the temporary construction easement; and

WHEREAS, based on the County's acquisition of other properties in the area in connection with the Project, and considering the assessed value of Tax Map Parcel No. 20-38, the County believes the property value is \$10,000.00 per acre. Based on the area taken, the value of Tax Map Parcel No. 20-38 as a whole, and the absence of any damages to the remainder of Tax Map Parcel No. 20-38, the County offers the owners of Tax Map Parcel No. 20-38 the sum of \$480.00 as compensation and/or damages, if any, for the temporary construction easement; and

WHEREAS, the temporary construction easement is necessary for the installation of public utilities, and the County is authorized to condemn property for the installation of public utilities by Va. Code Ann. §§ 15.2-1901.1 and 15.2-1902(1) and to institute and conduct condemnation proceedings under Chapter 3 of Title 25.1 of the Code of Virginia, following adoption of a resolution after conducting a public hearing meeting the requirements of Va. Code Ann. § 15.2-1905; and

WHEREAS, after proper publication of notice, a public hearing was conducted to consider the adoption of this Resolution.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors of Greensville County, Virginia, (the "Board"), as follows:

1. This Resolution incorporates the Recitals stated above.
2. The Board declares its intent to enter and take the temporary construction easement as necessary for the purpose of installing public utilities along U. S. Highway 58, prior to the conclusion of condemnation proceedings instituted under Va. Code Ann. § 25.1-300, et seq., and for all other purposes incidental thereto.
3. The Project is subject to specific financing and other scheduling requirements. The County must be able to enter and take the temporary construction easement to enable the installation of public utilities prior to completing condemnation proceedings, because financing and other scheduling requirements require the County to proceed with the award of construction contracts earlier than said condemnation proceedings can be completed.
4. Based on the County's acquisition of other properties in the area in connection with the Project, and considering the assessed value of the Tax Map Parcel No. 20-38, the area taken for the temporary construction easement, and the absence of any damages to the remainder of Tax Map Parcel No. 20-38, the Board concludes that the temporary construction easement has a value of \$480.00, as compensation and/or damages, if any.
5. The County offers the owners of Tax Map Parcel No. 20-38 the sum of \$480.00 as compensation and/or damages, if any, for the temporary construction easement.

6. The County will continue to make a bona fide effort to purchase the temporary construction easement from David Palmer. Because Thomas O'Neal Palmer cannot be located, a bona fide effort to purchase all of the interests in the temporary construction easement cannot be made.
7. The Board approves the condemnation and acquisition of the temporary construction easement which are necessary and incidental to the installation of public utilities for public use as authorized by Va. Code Ann. § 15.2-1904.
8. The Board certifies that this acquisition has been reviewed by the County for purposes of complying with Va. Code Ann. § 1-219.1.
9. The Board directs the County Attorney, and, to the extent necessary, the Chairman or Vice-Chairman of the Board, or the County Administrator, to complete the procedure and prepare and execute any necessary documents, in order to acquire the temporary construction easement, including filing a condemnation petition to initiate the condemnation action in the Board's name, payment of the offer amount into the Greensville County Circuit Court, filing a Certificate of Take, and any other necessary actions in accordance with the procedures of Chapter 3 of Title 25.1 of the Code of Virginia.
10. This Resolution shall be effective upon its adoption.

Supervisor Ferguson moved, seconded by Supervisor Lee, to approve Resolution #16-90. Voting aye: Supervisors Bryant, Ferguson, Lee and Chairman Wiley.

In Re: Road Matters – Mr. Joe Lomax, VDOT's Residency Administrator

Mr. Lomax addressed the Board of Supervisors and introduced the Superintendent, Mr. Kevin Gunn; Mr. Hal Godfrey, Maintenance Operations Manager and Mr. Bobby Baker, Consultant Construction Manager.

Route 301 Bridge – Mr. Lomax stated that a press release was put out today where VDOT was urging motorists to obey the signage on Route 301. He stated that the citizens were ignoring the signs and warnings placed at the construction site and not using the detour. He also stated that they were coming up to the bridge going south, and instead of using the detour, the citizens were taking the crossover, peaking above and going south in the northbound lanes which was very hazardous and a call for a disaster. Mr. Lomax stated that the state police would be monitoring that area and those in violation, would be ticketed for reckless driving.

Mr. Lomax stated that the work was ongoing, the test piles were being driven, the contractor was within 1% of his work for his schedule and would begin the structural wall in February.

Supervisor Ferguson asked what the time frame was for the construction. Mr. Lomax stated about two years which would be 2017.

Kevin Gunn's Work – Mr. Lomax stated that Mr. Gunn would have two supervisors under him from this point forward to keep up with the workload and making sure that the office and outside work was being done. He stated that work had been done in the Washington Park area. Ditches were cleaned on Beef Road, Brink Road, Moonlight Road, Crescent Road and Bel Meadows Drive. He also stated that maintenance had cut back Route 600 for sight distance, repaired driveway pipe on Hwy 627 due to a traffic accident, handled soft spots on Route 602 and put in number three stone for base, maintenance stone in various areas, low shoulder work done on Pine Log Road and Hwy 58, skin patching on Brink Road, repaired potholes on Route 619, Purdy Road and Bryant's Corner, tarred and rocked areas on Crescent Road, cleaned all major cross pipes and drainage ways, and tarred and rocked Liberty Road. Mr. Lomax stated that he also had work orders from the citizens to include with the list just given. He further stated that his plans for the next two months were to repair the cross drain on Route 610, Allen Road, Doyle's Lake Road and repair shoulders on Route 607 and Brunswick Road, ditching on Route 730 Lowground Road and Route 622 Little Lowground Road. He also stated that he would be repairing shoulders on Creek Road due to high water, patching on Smokey Ordinary Road and 613 Whitehorse Road.

Meherrin Bridge – Mr. Lomax stated that the known dates were as follows: Preconstruction on January 12, 2016, Notice to Proceed was set for January 8 because VDOT had been asked for an early notice, but theoretically, traffic would not be impacted until sometime late in the summer and a fixed completion date of October 1, 2019 for everything. He then explained the plans for sequences of construction. Further discussion was held on some of items regarding the sequence of construction. Mr. Lomax stated that the start date should be January 18.

Supervisor Ferguson stated that he had noticed several accidents at Exit 11A. He asked if anything additional could be done other than what VDOT had already done. Mr. Lomax stated that he would have someone look in to it. Supervisor Ferguson also stated that he had asked Kevin several months ago to get the grade-all to cut the slope back at the Brink intersection. Kevin stated that there were a lot of utilities in that slope and they needed to come up with a decision on what could be done. He also asked that the brush be cleaned up on Hwy 627 before you get to the dumpster site. He further stated that on Hwy 627, before getting to Round Hill, a limb hanging down for about the past 6 months needed to be cut down. He then asked if the workers were going out on a regular basis to check the roads. Mr. Lomax stated yes.

Supervisor Bryant thanked Mr. Lomax for adding Hwy 622 and Hwy 730 to the list and that he would be following up with Kevin on a few more issues in those areas.

Mr. Lomax also stated that he had added a section of Brink Road, Drybread Road and Route 58 to the paving schedule for the summer. He stated that hopefully he would get full allocation in May.

Supervisor Ferguson also asked the status on the last portion of Independence Church Road be fixed. Mr. Lomax stated that they wanted to accelerate construction but was short on funding. He stated that the designers asked if the County could find a way to get extra funding

for the project somewhere in the range of \$200,000. He also stated that he told the designers no because the County's first priority was Hwy 614 and the Otterdam Road area. Mr. Lomax stated that he was hoping that with the six year plan this year, it would provide him enough money to get the project done.

Mr. Whittington stated at the first part of December, Staff had a meeting with a proposed business client down at Exit 4 and would be contacting VDOT within the next three weeks to see how things have progressed.

In Re: Citizens Comments

Mr. Whittington addressed the public stating that anyone wishing to address the Board of Supervisors to please come forward and state their name and address for the record.

Mr. Cornell Hines, 1537 Lowground Road, addressed the Board stating that there was a hole at the intersection of Hwy 610 and Hwy 614. He stated that it had been patched before but was not holding up and something permanent needed to be done.

In Re: Proposed Agreement with Local Choice for the Affordable Care Act

Mrs. Alice Whitby addressed the Board of Supervisors stating that employers now had to provide employees, along with their W2s, certification stating that the employees had credible health insurance that would also be sent to the IRS. She stated that Local Choice had agreed to provide the certifications for the County once the agreement was approved.

Supervisor Ferguson moved, seconded by Supervisor Lee, to approve the Agreement with Local Choice. Voting aye: Supervisors Bryant, Ferguson, Lee and Chairman Wiley.

In Re: Miscellaneous Matters

Mr. Whittington stated that located in the Friday Memo were the Staff Work Programs and Departmental Reports for the Board's review and comments.

Chairman Wiley asked if there were any questions. There were none.

In Re: Adjournment

With there being no further business, Supervisor Ferguson moved, seconded by Supervisor Lee, to adjourn the meeting. Voting aye: Supervisors Ferguson, Lee, Vaughan and Chairman Wiley.

At the request of the Honorable Michael C. Ferguson, staff has drafted a Resolution in support of dog hunting in Virginia and asks that the Board adopt the attached resolution.

**SUPPORT OF USING HUNTING DOGS IN THE COMMONWEALTH OF VIRGINIA
AS PRESCRIBED IN CURRENT LAWS**

WHEREAS, Greensville County is blessed with a bounty of wildlife, and hunting helps develop an appreciation for our natural resources; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Greensville County is very interested in preserving the use of hunting with dogs in Greensville County and the Commonwealth of Virginia; and

WHEREAS, hunters throughout the Commonwealth, our Region, and Greensville County contribute to our economy, help form conservation movements, promote laws to stop the uncontrolled exploitation of wildlife, and work to establish gaming laws that are backed by enforcement; and

WHEREAS, the Greensville County tradition of hunting with dogs is a family-oriented tradition that teaches self-reliance, individual responsibility, and the values of community stewardship of our God given natural resources; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Greensville County recognizes the potential negative impacts of significant changes to the use of hunting with dogs for many of its citizens, including landowners and sportsmen; and

WHEREAS, the governing body of Greensville County recognizes that we must remain vigilant in the protection of these traditions and this valued way of life by supporting legal methods that protect our inherent rights to hunt with dogs, while also allowing for the enforcement against the inhumane treatment of hunting dogs and the right of property owners to protect against trespassers.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Greensville County Board of Supervisors that we hereby proclaim to our citizens, those of the region, and our great Commonwealth that the governing body of Greensville County supports the right to hunt with dogs, and further maintains our stance for the need for enforcement of animal cruelty and current state trespassing laws; and

HEREBY BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Greensville County Board of Supervisors supports our heritage of hunting with dogs and opposes any actions on the part of the Virginia Department of Game and Inland Fisheries and the General Assembly of Virginia that are detrimental to that tradition.

The Hunting Dog Owner's Code of Ethics

- 1. I will provide proper care for my dogs including food, water, medical care and shelter and will firmly insist other hunting dog owners do the same.**
- 2. I will provide proper identification and contact information on all of my dogs.**
- 3. I will diligently work to retrieve my dogs by the end of the hunt recognizing it is my moral and ethical responsibility to retrieve every dog as quickly as possible. If I cannot locate a dog by the end of the hunt, I will do my best to retrieve it as quickly thereafter as reasonably achievable.**
- 4. I will only release my dogs on property on which I have permission to hunt and will not tolerate others releasing dogs on property where they do not have permission to hunt.**
- 5. I will find a proper home or shelter for any dog that I determine I cannot or will not keep. I will not abandon any dog and will not tolerate any one who does.**
- 6. I will consider myself a guest of the landowner, whether private, state or federal, always seeking permission upfront, and will conduct myself so I will be welcome in the future.**
- 7. I will do my best to tread lightly while afield, to carefully use only established roads and trails, to leave any gates as I find them (open or closed), and foremost to leave no litter.**
- 8. I will promote fair chase of game animals and ethical treatment of hunting dogs.**
- 9. I will strictly follow the rules of safe gun handling, obey all game laws and regulations and will report those who violate game laws and regulations.**
- 10. I will actively encourage young and new hunters to participate in and enjoy the thrill and camaraderie of hunting with dogs.**
- 11. While Virginia's "Right to Retrieve" law gives me legal standing to retrieve my dogs from any property, I will practice the "Right of Respect" toward landowners with whom I come into contact and their property. I will admonish my fellow hunters to do the same.**
- 12. I will always be mindful that I am the public face of all dog hunters when afield or in the community. I will strive to hold myself and others to the highest standards of behavior when hunting with my dogs so we all reflect well on the ancient and honorable tradition of hunting with dogs.**

HOUND HUNTING IS UNDER ATTACK IN VIRGINIA!

A little background; there is an organization which has been formed via Facebook, called the Virginia Landowners Association. This is a group of people that have a varying agenda.

Some of it's' members want to reform hound hunting within the Commonwealth, primarily "deer hound hunting". They want to implement programs similar to what has been put in place in Florida & Georgia. This would require permits to be issued by DGIF to hunters with dogs, and has severe penalties for a dog entering another piece of property. Specifically this plan would call for a warning, a substantial fine, and then loss of hunting privileges. The Georgia plan has a requirement for 1000 contiguous acres upon which to hunt, and a permit plan as well. In these states, a severe reduction in hunters and hunt clubs resulted. In Georgia, there was an immediate loss of 40% of all hunt clubs. Florida incurred a significant decrease in hunting license sales. Either of these plans would severely restrict the opportunity of small land owners to be able to hunt their own property, and if an unhappy neighbor desires, with 3 phone calls to DGIF, can eliminate hunting for that individual.

Another segment wants to end "RTR" the "Right to Retrieval Law"! Their desire is to make it illegal to enter any property to recover or retrieve ones dog. They want severe trespass penalties to be issued to anyone on their property at any time. Though landowner rights are to be respected by all, elimination of this law will impact most any type of dog hunter! The foxhunter, bear hunter, coon hunter, coyote & bobcat hunter, even the rabbit, squirrel, rabbit, turkey, and bird hunter, not just the deer dog hunter! Even your house pet will be affected! Part of this group wants to go so far as to issue "trespass tickets" to the dog....i.e....the dog's owner! If you own any of the dogs mentioned, they are coming after you!

There is a radical portion of this group which wants to totally end "dog hunting" and ultimately all hunting!! Their guise is to end deer dog hunting, which is the first step toward elimination of fox hunting (which they don't like either), coon hunting, etc.! Why, so that some can pursue their greedy desire to harvest the "big buck", which they have fed, and baited! Others claim they want total privacy, "some wonder what else they may be growing"!

An additional segment seeks to eliminate dog hunting in order to acquire leased lands on which to conduct "paid", "guided hunts". Something they cannot effectively do if there is a dog in the area causing "their deer" to potentially move from where they are set up! This has the potential to bring in large incomes for the select few pushing this agenda. To accomplish this, the group needs to have dog hunting eliminated, and baiting legalized! And there are some in this group who would like to have "high fence deer farms" approved, whereby they can then conduct expensive hunts to shoot their farm raised trophies! Added pressure would be made by the "big money" interests to DGIF or the Legislature to allow this type of hunting!

The impact of these actions would have a huge impact on the Commonwealth! DGIF is primarily funded through license sales, & taxation of the sale of the majority of hunting and fishing items, weapons etc. Reduction of these funds would then negatively impact the ability of DGIF to adequately function. Small business owners, in local communities, would be drastically affected by reduced revenues from the lack of hunters in their areas spending monies. Many other businesses, large & small, would be financially affected; pet stores, Vet's, dog food manufacturers, any and all businesses that sell hunting or dog items, counties lose revenue of kennels licenses, and dog licenses, and the list goes on and on!

Landowners, especially those that own large tracts of land, stand to lose "leasing revenue". A number of smaller landowners utilize the "lease" income to pay real estate taxes on their properties. A representative of one of the large timber/land holding companies stated that loss of "land lease revenue" would cause an annual income reduction of 20-25% of their income stream! A pretty substantial impact!

This organization has brought to bear pressure on DGIF by its' launch of a huge complaint program, whether legitimate or not to try to prove that their "perceived problems" are substantial enough to warrant severe restriction or elimination of deer HOUND hunting". Note the word "hound", because some of them want to be able to continue to hunt "bird dogs". Through this pressure and constant "hounding" (pun intended) of DGIF & the Board of Directors, there has been the issuance of a directive to DGIF staff, to study the issues, & put together a report with recommendations to the Board at the January 20th, 2016 Board meeting.

It is time to meet this threat "head-on" by notifying the Board members of DGIF, & Director Duncan that we do not support the radical agenda sought by this landowners group! Let them know that you as a hunter, business person,

& landowner, support “deer hound hunting” in Virginia! Let them know you do not support the proposed changes which would severely reduce, curtail, or eliminate deer hound hunting!

Let them know that there are sufficient laws & regulations, WHICH IF PROPERLY ENFORCED, address the purported problem. AB

DGIF Facts about Dog Complaints

The minute you hear someone complaining about hunters with dogs, you only have to listen for a minute or two to know what is really on their mind. They will begin with a litany alleged problems and offenses they say justify eliminating hunting with dogs in Virginia. It’s sad but true that most of these “problems” are a re-hash of some alleged slight or incident that a friend claims to have experienced.

Let’s be frank some of our folks are a problem, but the absolute truth that the real problem lies elsewhere. In 2007, a couple of landowners, who were claiming to have big problems because dogs occasionally crossed their property, pulled enough strings with Governor Tim Kaine to get the Hound study going. Those landowners were really trying to run local the competition out of the neighborhood, so they could have the game all to themselves. In 2014, a couple of folks who had the idea that if they could end hunting with dogs, they could have their own way with commercial hunting.

In both of these examples, some hunters bought the lie that their hunting would improve if dogs were no longer used. The truth about the impact of hunting with dogs was distorted by people who simply did not know what they didn’t know.

A very small group of folks continue to complain about Virginia’s tradition of hunting with hounds. They will tell you that trespassing and “turning dogs lose” on posted lands is a widespread problem. Our Code of Ethics makes it clear we do not tolerate lawless behavior. A very small number of opponents continue to raise a clamor simply because they want to legalize “Texas Style” hunting over bait! For commercial hunting to be economically feasible in Virginia, they needed to be able to hunt both days of the weekend, get dogs off the land so they can bait without having to fence the land, make hunting over bait legal and have the State recognize and regulate guides and outfitters. Why else would ten rich people try to raise \$100,000 to change the face of hunting in Virginia!

If they get their way, the average hunter, no matter whether dogs are used or not, will not be able to afford to lease land to hunt on!

Violations of law by people who hunt with dogs are not widespread nor are they more than isolated incidents! We support community policing by the Department of Game and Inland Fisheries as the solution to individual problems, and are using THEIR information to get the truth to you!

The facts speak for themselves! The reference to dogs includes violations involving waterfowlers, bird hunters, non-hunting dogs and hound hunters! (*Chart with the facts on the page 6*)

Ethical hunting

There are some that do not follow the laws of the Commonwealth. Law violators should be prosecuted for violations by the laws currently in place! We as hunters and individual citizens must respect their fellow citizens of the Commonwealth, and be ethical in our endeavors, hunting or otherwise!

The group calling themselves the Virginia Landowners Association is calling for a massive increase in complaints about hunting with dogs across Virginia. They realize as does DGIF that the numbers of complaints, summonses issued and convictions are so small that it is difficult to believe that reasonable people would believe that there is a widespread problem. The clamor that is being raised by these claims is being heard. **This is very easy to deal with, simply obey the law and be courteous at all times.**

Police your fellow hunters; REPORT Wildlife Violators by calling (1-800-237-5712). If you are approached about a complaint, write down the facts these notes they will be important. If you are harassed be polite but report that. It is against the law to impede the hunt.

If you are harassed by a CPO, first ask yourself if any of your group is a problem. If your group has violators or rude individuals YOU ARE the problem and are hurting all of us. If you are obeying the law and are respecting your neighbors and still believe you are being treated unfairly or rudely then report that to your DGIF Board member and your legislator. The staff of DGIF is paid by Sportsmen's money, you are their employers!

Lack of Game Wardens

Outdoor writer Bill Cochran reports that Governor McAuliffe has blocked the hiring of CPO's (Game Wardens) due to lack of diversity in the force and the applicant pool. Bill reports that 147 Game Warden positions are currently filed. DGIF is authorized to employ approximately 192. It was also reported that moral is very low among the warden force.

The Vahda supported the hiring of additional wardens in the past. Among those vacancies are the three top positions immediately below Coronel Ron Henry, Chief of Law Enforcement Division. Those key supervisor positions have been vacant for nearly three years. With the Lt. Coronel and two major positions vacant it is no wonder that supervision and communication within the warden's ranks has been inconsistent at best.

New Chairman of House Agriculture Chosen

Danny Marshall (R-Danville) has been chosen to be Chairman of the very important House of Delegates Agriculture, Chesapeake and Natural Resources Committee replacing former Chairman Ed Scott, who chose not to seek re-election. Delegate Marshall has been a true friend to Virginia's Sportsmen and we look forward to working with him.

Duncan initiates Study of Lead Ammo

DGIF Executive Director Bob Duncan announced at the Agency Advisory Committee meeting said he had tasked David Whitehurst to lead a study of the impact on Virginia's wildlife of the use of lead in ammunition. As you may know the banning of lead in ammunition in California has driven up the cost of ammunition dramatically. He mentioned Ed Clark, Wildlife Center of Virginia, in his remarks as being a major supporter of the reduction in the use of lead ammo by hunters. I don't know how muzzleloaders shoot with projectiles other than lead or what will replace lead for buckshot. We do know what it would do to the cost of ammunition if all copper or other remedies were required. Can you imagine all copper buckshot?



Foundation a Great Tax Deductible Charity

Now, as the holidays approach, is a great time to consider an individual or business contribution to the Virginia Hunting Dog Alliance Foundation. The Foundation is a tax deductible educational (501c3) devoted to promoting ethical hunting and our Virginia traditions. Our Dogs and Other Partnership

Having mailed the last of late Virginia season Woodcock wings to U.S. Fish and Wildlife, the girls (German Shorthaired Pointers) and I turned to Ruffed Grouse until the end of February. We hunted Woodcock covers on DGIF's Wildlife Management Areas and had a hoot. Woodcock offer great hunting for bird-dogs and the people they let hunt with them. Reading the last VAHDA Newsletter and thinking about wrapping up Woodcock season reminded me of how important it is for people who are fortunate enough to hunt with dogs to adhere to the recommendations in the 31 December 2014 VAHDA Newsletter (ethical, considerate, responsible, accountable and therefore easily legal hunting). When first hearing about VAHDA several years ago, I thought only about deer hunting but quickly realized I "have a dog in that hunt", too; and, later learned that I share many concerns with VAHDA. With dogs as the first common link, other shared concerns and opportunities came to mind. These concerns relate to public policy directed toward key areas: (1) quality habitat, (2) access, (3) continued hunting with dogs and (4) partnerships.

No matter what we hunt, quality habitat and access are among the major controlling factors (dogs or not). Individuals, clubs and hunting conservation organizations at every level can partner to help assure quality habitat and access. As far as habitat, Young Forests and Old Field Succession produce the bedding, breeding, rearing and protective cover (high stem density) many game and non-game species must have to survive. Many hunt clubs target this type of forest/field mix. Many hunt clubs recruit/accept members who hunt game other than the main purpose of the hunt club; some may attract non-hunting wildlife enthusiasts (e.g., birders). One example is a

nearby bear hunt club that leases wisely managed tracts of mountain land. Bear, deer, turkey, woodcock and grouse hunters share thousands of acres to everyone's advantage (including the land owners).

Ethical practices, taking care of, and improving the land, go far in securing and maintaining access. So, as I hunt Virginia's public land mainly alone with two German Shorthair Pointers it occurs to me that my solitary hunt is not really solitary. Many other hunters and organizations have already helped provide me and my dogs with access and habitat. Here's to exploring further how to support current and create more partnerships across Virginia's dog hunting community. And, here's to applying those partnerships to increased access and improved habitat. [Insert suitable beverage toast here].

Our individual and collective voices can have an impact on land management policies and practices. Recently, hunting conservation organizations have increased their focus on active management of U.S. National Forests and other public lands. Governmental and non-governmental organizations stand ready to help private landowners effectively manage for wildlife that includes game and non-game species. In fact, a study of rural landowners in Upstate New York described in today's *Outdoor Wire* noted a strong link between wildlife recreation and conservation. This Cornell University study documented that both hunters and birders contributed 4-5 times more toward conservation efforts than those who do not participate in outdoor recreation. Those respondents who self-identified as both birders and hunters were eight times more likely to engage in conservation activities. Likely we have untapped partners out there who can help with access and habitat. Here's to new partners!

Virginia Wildlife Habitat Coalition

A new organization that supports healthy forest habitat, the Virginia Wildlife Habitat Coalition is seeking to improve wildlife habitat on public lands managed by the National Forest Service and DGIF. Wayne Thacker, author of the above article, is the driving force in this effort to increase the voice of Sportsmen in the management of our public lands in Virginia. The Virginia Hunting Dog Alliance has joined this coalition. The mission and objectives are found below.

Mission: The Virginia Wildlife Habitat Coalition actively supports through advocacy and education the stewardship and active management of our public forest resources, based on sound science for the benefit of all wildlife. The coalition works collaboratively to provide input and support for habitat projects for both game and nongame species in the George Washington/Jefferson National Forest and the Virginia Department of Game and Inland Fisheries Wildlife Management Areas.

Objective: The VWHC seeks to increase early successional habitat, to a level which provides for a balanced mosaic and varied age-class stands in the forest ecosystems on GW/JEFF and DGIF WMAs. We will advocate and educate toward this end.

Know the Law

§ 18.2-132. Trespass by hunters and fishers.

Any person who goes on the lands, waters, ponds, boats or blinds of another to hunt, fish or trap without the consent of the landowner or his agent shall be deemed guilty of a Class 3 misdemeanor.

§ 18.2-133. Refusal of person on land, etc., of another to identify himself.

Any person who goes on the lands, waters, ponds, boats or blinds of another to hunt, fish, or trap and willfully refuses to identify himself when requested by the landowner or his agent so to do shall be deemed guilty of a Class 4 misdemeanor.

§ 18.2-134. Trespass on posted property.

Any person who goes on the lands, waters, ponds, boats or blinds of another, which have been posted in accordance with the provisions of § [18.2-134.1](#), to hunt, fish or trap except with the written consent of or in the presence of the owner or his agent shall be guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor.

§ 18.2-134.1. Method of posting lands.

A. The owner or lessee of property described in § [18.2-134](#) may post property by (i) placing signs prohibiting hunting, fishing or trapping where they may reasonably be seen; or (ii) placing identifying paint marks on trees or posts at each road entrance and adjacent to public roadways and public waterways adjoining the property. Each paint mark shall be a vertical line of at least two inches in width and at least eight inches in length and the center of the mark shall be no less than three feet nor more than six feet from the ground or normal water surface. Such paint marks shall be readily visible to any person approaching the property.

B. The type and color of the paint to be used for posting shall be prescribed by the Department of Game and Inland Fisheries.

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

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AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS
AND THE TREASURER OF GREENSVILLE COUNTY, VIRGINIA

THIS AGREEMENT , effective January 1, 2016, and established pursuant to Virginia law and governed thereby, is between Pamela A. Lifsey, Treasurer (hereinafter referred to as "Treasurer") and the Board of Supervisors of Greensville County, Virginia.

The Treasurer and the Board of Supervisors hereby agree that the County Personnel Policy (the "Personnel Manual") is extended to cover all employees and deputies of the Treasurer, except for the Treasurer herself, thereby establishing a uniform personnel system to the end that the Treasurer's employees will have the same rights and benefits and will be subject to the same procedures and regulations as other County employees, except as provided herein. The Treasurer shall have all authority as designated by the Personnel Manual for a Department Head.

Employees and deputies of the Treasurer will be subject to the County's personnel policies and regulations, except they shall have no rights under the County's grievance procedure. The advertising of position vacancies will be consistent with Virginia Code Section 15.2-1604 and will be handled by Greensville County Human Resources. Fringe benefits and future pay increases shall be set by the Board of Supervisors notwithstanding salary levels set by the State Compensation Board, but in no event shall the salary be less than that established by the State Compensation Board.

Greensville County Human Resources will assist the Treasurer, as needed , with the following: (1) Hiring, promoting, transferring or appointing employees and deputies, (2) Disciplining, suspending, demoting, dismissing or terminating the appointment of any employee or deputy. The Treasurer has the authority to terminate the appointment of a deputy pursuant to Virginia Code Section 15.2-1603, and nothing herein affects those statutory rights and obligations. All employees of the Treasurer are at-will.

This Agreement shall remain in effect until December 31, 2019, unless it is canceled by either party by the giving of 60 days written notice to the other party. In the event this Agreement is canceled, no salary for any employee or deputy shall be diminished should the salary set by the State Compensation Board be less than that established by the Board. The Board, however, shall not be obligated to increase the salary of any employee or deputy so affected above the level set by the State Compensation Board regardless of increases provided to other employees of the County or increases established by the Virginia General Assembly.

The County Human Resources Office shall maintain the official records of all employment actions for employees and deputies of the Treasurer. Records and forms will be submitted in accordance with procedures outlined by the County Personnel Policy.

AGREEMENT FOR FIRE HYDRANT RENTAL, FIRE PROTECTION SERVICES AND WATER SUPPLY SERVICES BETWEEN THE GREENSVILLE COUNTY WATER AND SEWER AUTHORITY AND GREENSVILLE COUNTY, VIRGINIA

This Agreement for Fire Hydrant Rental, Fire Protection Services, and Water Supply Services between the Greensville County Water and Sewer Authority and Greensville County, Virginia is executed this ____ day of _____, 2016 (the “Effective Date”), by and between the Greensville County Water and Sewer Authority, a public body corporate and politic under the laws of the Commonwealth of Virginia (the “GCWSA”) and Greensville County, Virginia, a Virginia County (the “County”) (collectively, the “Parties” and individually, a “Party”).

RECITALS

1. The GCWSA owns the Jarratt Water Treatment Plant and associated water distribution system improvements (the “GCWSA Water System”).
2. The GCWSA and the Virginia Electric and Power Company, a Virginia public service corporation (“Dominion Virginia Power”), have entered into the Dominion Virginia Power Generating Plant Water and Wastewater Agreement dated April 20, 2015 (the “DVP Agreement”).
3. The DVP Agreement provides for:
 - a. The development of a gas fired combined cycle power generating facility in Greensville County (the “DVP Project”).
 - b. The GCWSA to provide water supply services to the DVP Project.
 - c. The GCWSA to construct and operate certain water system improvements including, without limitation, a 900 million gallon raw water storage reservoir, expansion of the Jarratt Water Treatment Plant, the Route 58 elevated water tank, the Route 58 water booster station and water main improvements, the

raw water intake structure from the Nottoway River, an intermediate pump station, raw water mains, and fire hydrants along the water distribution lines on Routes 58, 605, 607, and Allen Road, Otterdam Road, and Westover Hills Avenue (collectively, the “Water System Improvements”).

d. DVP to pay the GCWSA water connection fee and user charges.

4. The development of the DVP Project will result in substantial new public service corporation property tax revenues and other revenues to the County.

5. The Water System Improvements will allow the GCWSA to make fire hydrants available for fire protection services in areas of the County where fire hydrants are not available. The Water System Improvements will also allow the GCWSA to provide new or improved water supply services to the County and its residents.

6. The GCWSA intends to borrow funds from the USDA Rural Development Agency to pay a portion of the cost of the Water System Improvements (the “Rural Development Loan”).

7. The GCWSA is not expected to collect new revenues from the Water System Improvements in amounts sufficient to pay the full cost of the debt service on the Rural Development Loan.

8. The County will benefit from the Water System Improvements because of the availability of fire hydrants for improved fire protection services and new and improved water supply services in the County.

9. The County wishes to enter into this Agreement to rent fire hydrants and to improve water supply services in the County.

10. The obligation of the County to make payments to the GCWSA pursuant to this Agreement shall be conditioned on the GCWSA constructing, operating and maintaining its Water System and the Water System Improvements, providing water supply services to the DVP Project as provided for in the DVP Agreement, complying with the DVP Agreement, and the availability of fire hydrants as constructed and maintained as part of the Water System Improvements.

11. Virginia Code Ann. §§ 15.2-2134, 15.2-5114(11) and (12), and 15.2-5147 authorize the GCWSA and the County to enter into this Agreement.

AGREEMENT

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the foregoing Recitals, which are a part of this Agreement, the benefits of the Parties to be realized from this Agreement, the mutual covenants contained herein, and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the Parties covenant and agree as follows:

ARTICLE I

INCORPORATION OF RECITALS

1.1 The foregoing recitals are hereby incorporated in this Agreement by reference.

ARTICLE II

GCWSA SERVICE OBLIGATIONS

2.1 The GCWSA shall provide the following services:

2.1.1. Construct, maintain and operate the Water System Improvements in accordance with the DVP Agreement.

2.1.2. Comply with its obligations pursuant to the DVP Agreement.

2.1.3 Construct and maintain fire hydrants along Routes 58, 605, 607; Allen Road; Otterdam Road, Westover Hills Avenue, and Jarrett Water Treatment Plant Mains as part of the Water System Improvements.

ARTICLE III

USE OF FIRE HYDRANTS

3.1 The County shall have the right to authorize volunteer fire departments, other firefighting agencies, and law enforcement agencies to use all hydrants that are part of the GCWSA Water System for fire protection services and other appropriate purposes.

ARTICLE IV

BASE RENTAL PAYMENT

4.1 **Initial Rental Payments.** Subject to the terms of this Agreement, the County shall make quarterly payments of Two Hundred and Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000), for a total of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) per year (the "Base Rental Payment").

4.1.1 The amount of the Base Rental Payment is based on Three Thousand Two Hundred and Thirty Six Dollars and Twenty Five Cents (\$3,236.25) per hydrant constructed and maintained as part of the Water System Improvements (totalling approximately 309 hydrants).

4.1.2 The County shall begin making the Base Rental Payments three months after the closing of the Rural Development Loan for Phase I of the Water System Improvements.

4.1.3 The County shall make the quarterly installment payments by October 1, January 1, April 1, and July 1 of each fiscal year as the GCWSA renders services pursuant to this Agreement.

4.2 **Duration of Base Rental Payments.** The County shall make the Initial Rental Payments pursuant to this Article IV for five calendar years after the Initial Service Date. The

Parties expect the Initial Service Date to be approximately October 1, 2017. The Parties may adjust the payment schedule under this Agreement based on the actual Initial Service Date.

4.3 **Interim Financing**

a. The Parties anticipate that the GCWSA will arrange for interim financing for the acquisition of real property and the development of the Water System Improvements prior to the closing of the Rural Development Loan.

b. The proceeds of the Rural Development Loan will be used, in part, to retire the interim financing arrangements.

c. Subject to the terms of this Agreement, the County will make payments to the GCWSA to allow the GCWSA to make debt service payments on the interim financing arrangements.

ARTICLE V

ADJUSTED RENTAL PAYMENTS AND BUDGET REPORTING

5.1 The Parties anticipate that the GCWSA will receive increased revenues from the Water System Improvements over time. The Parties wish to provide a mechanism for the amount of the Base Rental Payments to decrease based on the GCWSA receiving additional revenues in future years.

5.2 **Budget Reporting**. The GCWSA shall submit an annual budget report and funding request to the County no later than January 31 of each year. The annual budget report and funding request shall provide for and report:

5.2.1 All revenue related to the Water System Improvements for the prior fiscal year and projected for the next fiscal year.

5.2.2 All other revenue available to the GCWSA to pay debt service on the Rural Development Loan.

5.2.3 The amount of debt service due on the Rural Development Loan for the next fiscal year.

5.2.4 The shortfall amount needed by the GCWSA to pay the debt service on the Rural Development Loan for the next fiscal year.

5.2.5 The schedule of debt service payment dates due on the Rural Development Loan for the next fiscal year.

5.2.6 The number of fire hydrants served by the Water System Improvements and the number of fire hydrants in the Water Supply System.

5.3 **Adjusted Rental Payments.** The amount of the County's rental payments shall be adjusted on an annual basis. The amount of the County annual rental payments shall be adjusted downward on a proportionate per fire hydrant basis based on any reduction in the shortfall amount needed by the GCWSA to pay the debt service on the Rural Development Loan.

5.3.1 In no event shall the County be obligated to make payments in any fiscal year exceeding the amount of the Base Rent Payment.

5.3.2 The County shall make quarterly installment payments of the adjusted annual rent by October 1, December 31, April 1, and July 1 of each year as the GCWSA renders services pursuant to this Agreement.

5.4 **Excused Payments.** The County shall not be required to make any payment to the GCWSA under this Agreement for any year in which the GCWSA has adequate revenue available from the Water System Improvements or otherwise to pay the debt service on the Rural Development Loan.

ARTICLE VI

GCWSA USE OF FUNDS

6.1 The GCWSA shall use payments by the County solely for the purpose of paying debt service on the Rural Development Loan.

ARTICLE VII

TERM

7.1 This Agreement shall be for a term commencing as of the Effective Date and continuing until December 31 of the year which is the fortieth year after the closing of the Rural Development Loan for Phase II of the Water System Improvements.

ARTICLE VIII

DEFAULT

8.1 **Termination for Default.** Either the County or the GCWSA may terminate this Agreement if any Party fails to perform any material obligation hereunder and such failure is not cured within ninety (90) days of notice thereof. Any notice of default shall specify the default with reasonable specificity. If the identified default reasonably requires more than ninety (90) days to cure, the time allowed to cure the default shall be extended for a reasonable time provided the defaulting party diligently pursues curing the default.

ARTICLE IX

ASSIGNMENT

9.1 The GCWSA shall assign this Agreement and any or all of its rights, title and interest hereunder to Rural Development, or other lender, as security in connection with constructing or maintaining the Water System Improvements, with the County's prior written consent, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld or delayed. All covenants, terms,

conditions, and provisions of this Agreement shall extend to and be binding upon any successors and assigns to the Parties hereto.

a. This Agreement, and any or all of its rights, title and interest is hereby assigned to Rural Development as additional security for its loans.

9.2 **Cooperation with Lenders**. The County shall cooperate with the GCWSA and Rural Development, or other GCWSA lenders, to execute and deliver estoppel agreements, assignments and other documents required by Rural Development or other lenders to protect a security interest, providing that such documents do not adversely change the rights and obligations of the County.

ARTICLE X

NOTICES

10.1 **Notices**. All requests, notices and other communications required or permitted to be given under this Agreement shall be in writing and delivered personally or sent by electronic means, by nationally recognized express-type courier service requiring delivery receipts, or postage prepaid by U. S. Mail, return receipt requested, as follows:

Notices shall be deemed received by the addressee on the day of actual receipt unless such day is not a business day (i.e., Monday through Friday, excluding holidays recognized by the Commonwealth of Virginia or the government of the United States), in which case such notice shall be deemed to have been received on the next business day. However, if such notice is received after 5:00 pm on a business day it shall be deemed delivered the next business day. Changes of address or addressees for notice shall comply with this **Section 10.1**.

ARTICLE XI

MISCELLANEOUS

11.1 **No Waiver**. The waiver by any Party of any failure on the part of any other Party to perform any of its obligations under this Agreement shall not be construed as a waiver of any future or continuing failure or failures, whether similar or dissimilar thereto.

11.2 **Dispute Resolution**. In the event of any dispute between or among the Parties arising out of or in connection with this Agreement, the Parties shall attempt, promptly and in good faith, to resolve any such dispute. If the Parties are unable to resolve such dispute within a reasonable time (not to exceed ninety days), then any Party may submit such dispute to non-binding mediation. Each Party shall bear its own expenses in connection with the mediation and share equally the fees and expenses of the mediator. If the dispute cannot be resolved through mediation within a reasonable time, then the parties shall be free to pursue any right or remedy available to them under applicable law.

11.3 **Choice of Law and Venue.**

11.3.1 **Choice of Law.** This Agreement, and all amendments and modifications hereof, and all documents and instruments executed and delivered pursuant hereto or in connection herewith, shall be governed by and construed and enforced in accordance with the internal laws and codes of the Commonwealth of Virginia, without regard to its principles of conflict of laws.

11.3.2 **Venue.** All judicial actions or proceedings brought against a Party with respect to this Agreement shall be brought in the circuit court of Greensville County, and by its execution and delivery of this Agreement, each Party accepts, generally and unconditionally, the exclusive jurisdiction of the aforesaid state courts. Each Party irrevocably waives any objection (including any objection based upon the grounds of “forum non conveniens”) that it now or hereafter may have to the bringing or prosecution of any such action or proceeding with respect to this Agreement or the documents and instruments contemplated hereby in the Commonwealth of Virginia.

11.3.3 **Waiver of Jury Trial.** Each party acknowledges and agrees that any controversy which may arise under this Agreement is likely to involve complicated and difficult issues, and therefore each Party hereby irrevocably and unconditionally waives any and all rights IT may have to a trial by jury in respect of any litigation resulting from, arising out of or relating to this Agreement or the transactions contemplated hereby.

11.4 **Limitation of Liability.** Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in this Agreement, whether as a result of breach of contract or tort, including negligence, strict liability or otherwise, neither Party hereto shall be liable for indirect, special, incidental, punitive, consequential, or exemplary damages, including loss of profits or revenue, loss of use, cost of

capital, down time costs, loss of opportunity, loss of goodwill and/or claims of customers of the other Party for such damages, and each Party hereby waives any right to the same and releases the other Party for such damages.

11.5 **Entire Agreement; Amendment.** This Agreement sets forth the full and complete understanding of the Parties with respect to the subject matter hereof as of the Effective Date, and supersedes any and all agreements and representations (oral or written) made or dated prior thereto. After the Effective Date, this Agreement may be supplemented and amended only by written agreement signed by authorized representatives of the Parties, and any proposed supplement or amendment made to the contrary shall be void *ab initio*.

11.6 **Headings; Usage of Certain Words.** The headings set forth in this Agreement are for convenience only and shall not be considered as part of this Agreement in any respect nor shall they in any way affect the substance of any provisions contained in this Agreement.

11.7 **Rules of Construction.** Each Party has reviewed and discussed this Agreement with counsel and agrees that this Agreement shall not be construed by applying any rule of construction providing for interpretation against the drafting Party.

11.8 **Severability.** In the event that any provision of this Agreement or the documents and instruments contemplated hereby is held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, prohibited or unenforceable for any reason, the Parties shall negotiate in good faith and agree to such amendments, modifications or supplements of or to this Agreement to give effect to the intentions of the Parties to the maximum extent practicable. The other terms of this Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.

11.9 **Counterparts.** The Parties may sign this Agreement in counterparts with the same effect as if all signing Parties signed the same document. All counterparts shall be construed together and constitute one and the same Agreement.
